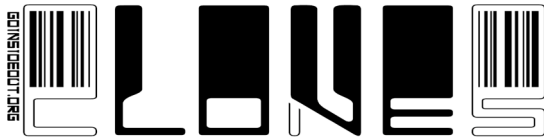

1 John 4:17-19 (The Message)

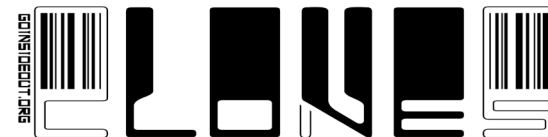
To Love, to Be Loved

17-18 God is love. When we take up permanent residence in a life of love, we live in God and God lives in us. This way, love has the run of the house, becomes at home and mature in us, so that we're free of worry on Judgment Day—our standing in the world is identical with Christ's. There is no room in love for fear. Well-formed love banishes fear. Since fear is crippling, a fearful life—fear of death, fear of judgment—is one not yet fully formed in love. 19. We, though, are going to love—love and be loved. First we were loved, now we love. He loved us first.

Thursday Night Group Time

How has this week as a whole impacted you, impacted us as a group?

Corinthians 5:17 The Message

16-20 Because of this decision we don't evaluate people by what they have or how they look. We looked at the Messiah that way once and got it all wrong, as you know. We certainly don't look at him that way anymore. Now we look inside, and what we see is that anyone united with the Messiah gets a fresh start, is created new. The old life is gone; a new life burgeons! Look at it! All this comes from the God who settled the relationship between us and him, and then called us to settle our relationships with each other. God put the world square with himself through the Messiah, giving the world a fresh start by offering forgiveness of sins. God has given us the task of telling everyone what he is doing. We're Christ's representatives. God uses us to persuade men and women to drop their differences and enter into God's work of making things right between them. We're speaking for Christ himself now: Become friends with God; he's already a friend with you.

Reflect & Respond:

What do you think it means to receive God's love?

Is it easy for you to believe that God loves you? Why or why not?

If you experienced God's love tonight, what did it feel like?



Monday Morning Devotion:

Colossians 3:12 (The Message)

12-14 So, chosen by God for this new life of love, dress in the wardrobe God picked out for you: compassion, kindness, humility, quiet strength, discipline. Be even-tempered, content with second place, quick to forgive an offense. Forgive as quickly and completely as the Master forgave you. And regardless of what else you put on, wear love. It's your basic, all-purpose garment. Never be without it.

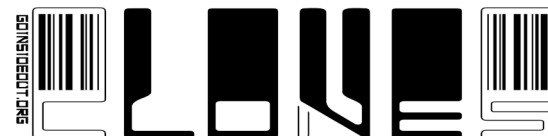
Personal Reflection:

THURSDAY MORNING PERSONAL DEVOTION

Galatians 5:13-15 (The Message)

13-15 It is absolutely clear that God has called you to a free life. Just make sure that you don't use this freedom as an excuse to do whatever you want to do and destroy your freedom. Rather, use your freedom to serve one another in love; that's how freedom grows. For everything we know about God's Word is summed up in a single sentence: Love others as you love yourself. That's an act of true freedom.

Personal Reflection:

What does it look like to put on love?

Pray and ask God to fill your heart with love, the kind that gets into your hands and feet and impacts others.



Monday Night Group Time:

Mark 12:30-31 (The Message)

29-31 Jesus said, "The first in importance is, 'Listen, Israel: The Lord your God is one; so love the Lord God with all your passion and prayer and intelligence and energy.' And here is the second: 'Love others as well as you love yourself.' There is no other commandment that ranks with these."

Reflect & Respond:

Take some time in your group to share what God did among you as a group, as individuals, and how God moved in the lives of those you served this week.



Wednesday Night Group Time:

1 John 3:18 (The Message)

When We Practice Real Love

My dear children, let's not just talk about love; let's practice real love. This is the only way we'll know we're living truly, living in God's reality.

Reflect & Respond

Was there a time today that you feel you were not loving others well?

Do you think it has anything to do with how you love yourself?

What is something you need to surrender that will enable you to love God, others and yourself well?



TUESDAY MORNING DEVOTION

Luke 6:27-36

27"But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, **28** bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. **29** If someone strikes you on one cheek, turn to him the other also. If someone takes your cloak, do not stop him from taking your tunic. **30** Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. **31** Do to others as you would have them do to you.

32"If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even 'sinners' love those who love them. **33** And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even 'sinners' do that. **34** And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even 'sinners' lend to 'sinners,' expecting to be repaid in full. **35** But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked. **36** Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

Personal Reflection:

Where have you seen the love of God this week, in yourself, your group, your job site, the people you are serving?

How have you, your group, or those you've served been transformed by the love of God this week?

Pray and ask God to give you His eyes and His heart for others.



Wednesday Morning Devotion:

1 John 4:10-12 (NIV)

10. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. 11. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. 12. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

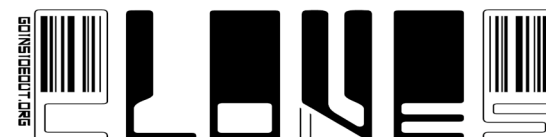
Personal Reflection:

Pray and ask God to soften your heart to those that are different than you, those that are difficult to love.



Tuesday Night Group Time

Galatians 2:19-21 (The Message)

19-21. What actually took place is this: I tried keeping rules and working my head off to please God, and it didn't work. So I quit being a "law man" so that I could be God's man. Christ's life showed me how, and enabled me to do it. I identified myself completely with him. Indeed, I have been crucified with Christ. My ego is no longer central. It is no longer important that I appear righteous before you or have your good opinion, and I am no longer driven to impress God. Christ lives in me. The life you see me living is not "mine," but it is lived by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I am not going to go back on that.

Is it not clear to you that to go back to that old rule-keeping, peer-pleasing religion would be an abandonment of everything personal and free in my relationship with God? I refuse to do that, to repudiate God's grace. If a living relationship with God could come by rule-keeping, then Christ died unnecessarily.

Reflect & Respond:

In your group time discuss the identity or label you laid at the cross tonight.

Go around the circle in your group and say how you have seen Christ in the person to your left this week.
